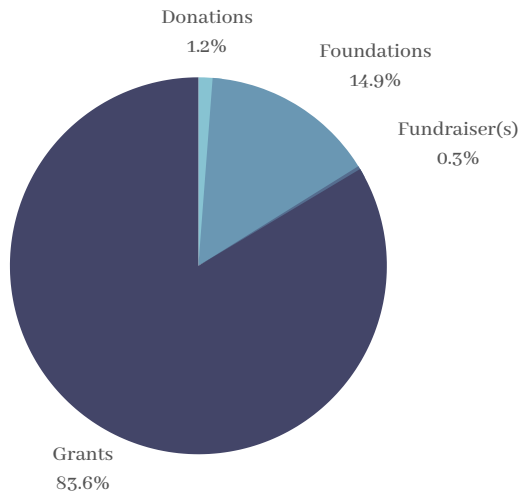

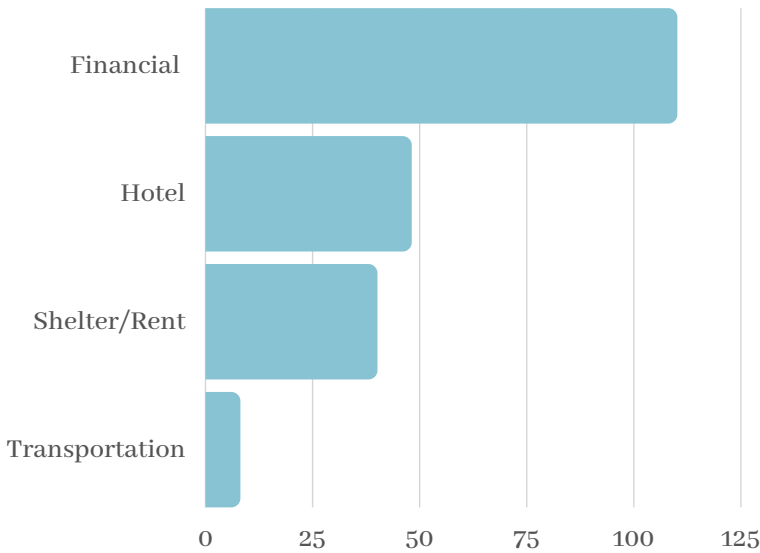


## Revenue By Source

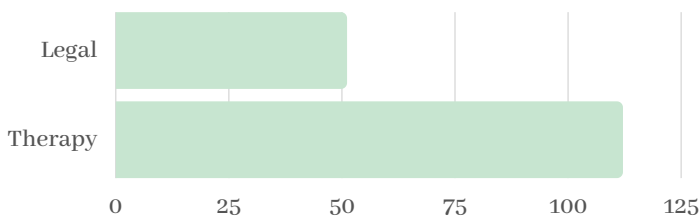

## # of Clients Receiving Assistance

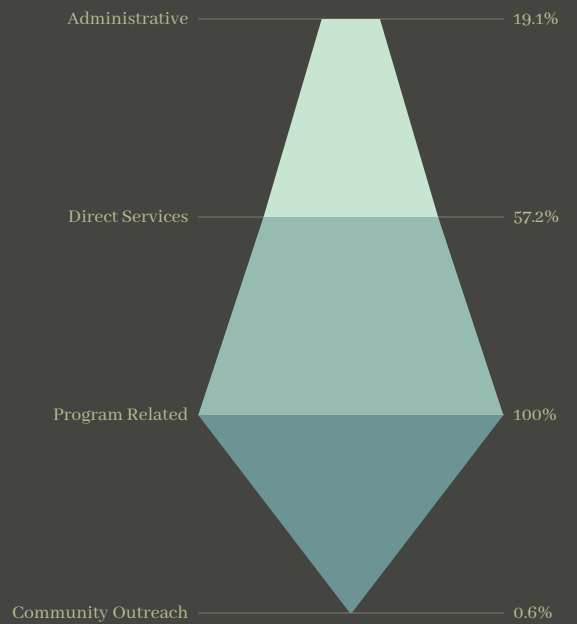


## # of Client Legal Cases/Therapy Sessions
